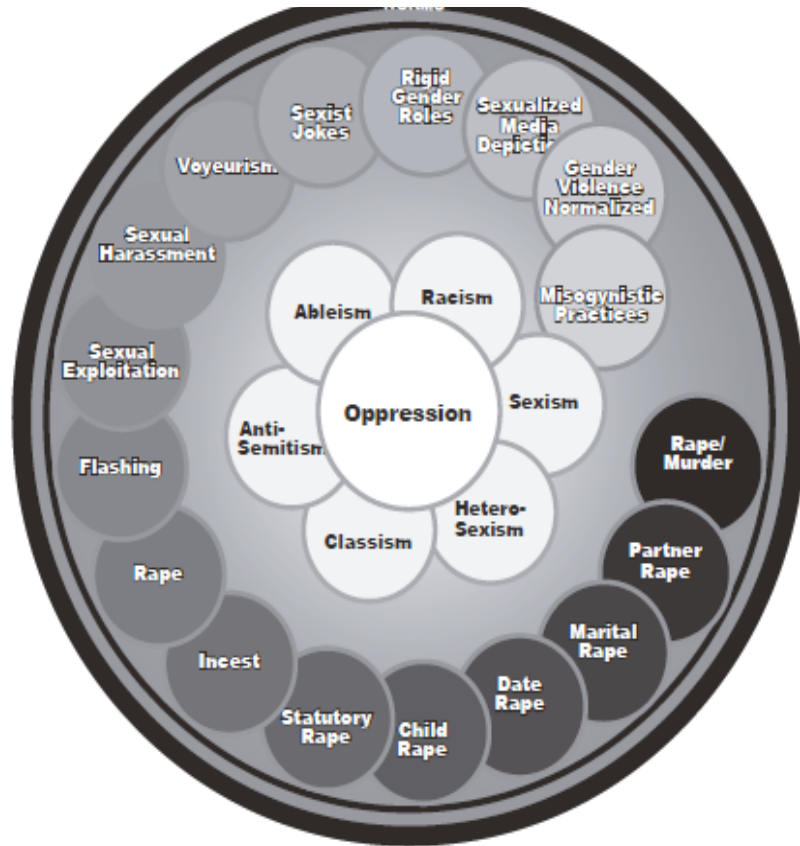

How are we defining gender identity at our agency?

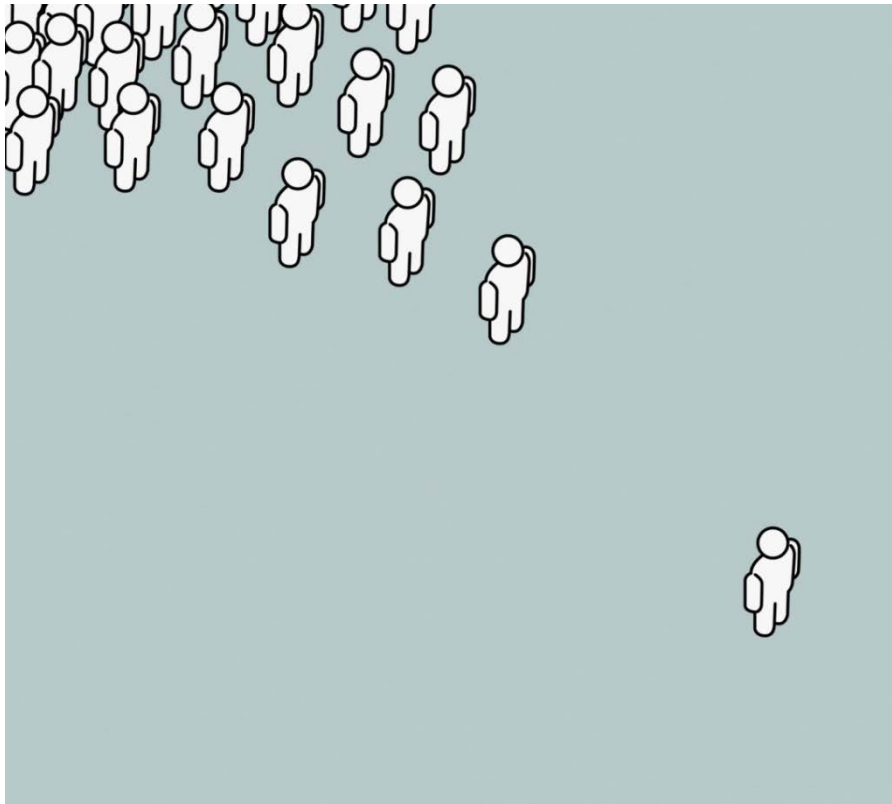
Reactions to violence
